Morristown Memorial Health Foundation

Jim Quinn is the Chief Development Officer of the Morristown Memorial Health Foundation at Morristown Memorial Hospital, a 680-bed hospital in Morristown, NJ. He joined Morristown Memorial in 1989 after 12 years with the fund-raising and public relations consulting firm of Brakeley, John Price Jones, Inc.

Under Mr. Quinn's supervision at Morristown Memorial, the Health Foundation has raised \$160 million in philanthropic support over the past decade. Since 1998 the Health Foundation completed an \$18 million campaign to build the Carol G. Simon Cancer Center, and then another \$10 million campaign to expand it, a \$30 million campaign to build the Goryeb Children's Hospital, and raised \$45 million to erect the Gagnon Cardiovascular Institute.

He has published three articles, and an innovative grateful patient program the Health Foundation recently launched was featured in a 2007 research publication of *The Advisory Board Company* based in Washington, DC. He has also lectured throughout the country on a range of Fund Development topics.

He received the 2001 Robert Smythe Award as Outstanding Professional Fundraiser from the Association of Fundraising Professionals, New Jersey Chapter.

Mr. Quinn is currently education chair for the Association for Healthcare Philanthropy's (AHP) Mid-Atlantic Region. He is a past member of the National Board of Directors of AHP and the National Board of the AHP Foundation. He is also a past member of the Board of Directors of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, New Jersey Chapter. He served for ten years on the Board of The Mayo Theatre for the Performing Arts in Morristown.
